

Logan Community Trailcare Program position descriptions

Trailcare Team Leader

As a Trailcare Team Leader, you play an important role in the conservation of our urban bushland by organising and leading a Trailcare group in the implementation of projects including - trailcare maintenance, trailcare restoration, erosion control and weed management.

Your key tasks will be to liaise with the Trailcare Officer, coordinate the Trailcare groups activities including project planning, working bees, record keeping and meetings.

Training: The Team Leader and Deputy Team Leader must attend a Council organised Trailcare induction Course, all other courses are optional.

Reports to: Trailcare Officer
Estimated hours of work: 4 hours per month.

Desirable skills and attributes: Outgoing friendly personality, good organisational and communication skills and a genuine interest in the environment.

Materials supplied by Council: Printed material, access to tools and equipment required, first aid kit and access to Trailcare library.

Deputy Team Leader

The same as the Team Leader, but in an assisting role to Team Leader or takes over the job when they are not available.

Trailcarer

As a Trailcarer, you play an important role in the conservation of our urban bushland through implementing bush restoration projects.

Your key tasks: carrying out trailcare maintenance, trailcare restoration, erosion control and weed management.

Training: At least 20% Including Team Leader and Deputy Team Leader) of the Trailcare Group must attend a Council organised Trailcare induction Course, all other courses are optional.

Reports to: Trailcare Team Leader and Trailcare Officer.

Estimated hours of work: 4 hours per month.

Desirable skills and attributes: outgoing friendly personality, good organisational and communication skills and a genuine interest in the environment.

Materials supplied by Council: printed material, access to tools and equipment required, first aid kit and access to Trailcare library.

- Controlling weeds
