MINIATURE HORSES AND PONIES

Under Logan City Council's animal keeping laws, the allowable number of miniature horses and ponies varies, depending on the size of your property.

Property size (square metres)	Allowable number
0 to 2,000	0
2,001 to 4,000	2 with Logan City Council approval (no stallions over the age of two years are permitted)
4,001 to 30,000	1 per 2,000 square metres without Logan City Council approval
	Up to 15 at a density of 1 per 2,000 square metres, including no more than one stallion over two years of age, with Logan City Council approval.
30,000+	Up to 30 at a density of no more than 1 per 2,000 square metres and no more than 2 stallions over the age of two years of age without Logan City Council approval

Infant animals are not counted until the animals are 12 months of age or weaned.

Enclosure requirements

The enclosure must be maintained in a clean and tidy state daily and constructed in such a way that it:

- prevents the animal from escaping
- is not within 10 metres of a neighbouring dwelling
- is not within 10 metres of any premises operated for the purposes of the manufacture, preparation, storage or sale of food for human consumption
- is at least two metres from the boundary of the property.

Enclosures for stallion(s) must consist of double fencing around the perimeter of the area where the stallion(s) is kept.

Approvals

Development Approvals

Assessment is required under Council's planning scheme to keep more than the approved numbers, as this is considered a development activity.

Licensing requirements may also exist under Logan's Licensing Local Law or state law.

General requirements

The owner and keeper must ensure that keeping the miniature horse/s or ponies does not result in:

- animal faeces build up
- breeding or harbouring of flies or vermin
- damage to property
- harm to human health or safety or personal injury
- nuisance
- significant disturbance, inconvenience or annoyance to a person's enjoyment of their place of residence
