# Nomination categories

### 1. Historic and/or natural value (i.e. Indigenous/cultivated origin)

- Determination of origin as a component of natural ecological community or cultivated/planted as part of historic development of the place;
- Including influences by historic figures, events and patterns of development.
- Examples:
  - o the tree is the site of an important event
  - o the tree/s are examples of remnant vegetation in developed areas.

### 2. Botanic or scientific value

- Associated with research and educational values, based on integrity, rarity and representative values.
- Examples:
  - o outstanding examples of species could be old, outstanding in size (height, trunk, canopy), unusual growth form
  - trees with limited and/or localised distribution that are known to be rare either locally or nationally
  - o trees that contribute to flora/fauna habitat/corridors
  - horticultural or genetic value could be important source of propagating stock, e.g. disease resistance, form or colour
  - endangered species.

### 3. Social, cultural and commemorative value

- Focusing on qualities such as the spiritual, political, national and cultural sentiment reflected by the broader population or smaller community groups.
- Includes commemorative events
- Examples:
  - o tree/s planted to mark certain points in time
  - o tree/s marking meeting places.

### 4. Visual and aesthetic value

- "Landmark" trees planted to define a location or destination.
- Planted or naturally occurring species of outstanding form, health or beauty which are a significant part of the local environment (street, park or natural landscape).
