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Policy title: REWARDS FOR INFORMATION ON VANDALISM

Directorate: COMMUNITY AND LIFESTYLE

Branch: PARKS

Policy objective: To establish guidelines for offering and paying rewards

for information following vandalism to the Council's

infrastructure.

Policy scope:

This policy applies to rewards offered by the Council for information leading to a conviction as a result of damage caused to park facilities or other Council infrastructure.

Definitions:

Not applicable.

Policy statement:

The following procedure is to be undertaken for this policy:

- 1. A reward of \$500 or some greater amount as may be determined by resolution of the Council may be offered in respect of information or evidence of specific acts of vandalism.
- 2. The reward must be offered to the first person who provides to the Council or Crimestoppers, information or evidence leading to the conviction of a person of an offence under a Local Law or other legislation.
- 3. The reward must be paid within thirty (30) days after that person is convicted of the offence.
- 4. Only one reward can be claimed.
- 5. If more than one person's information or evidence is required for conviction, the reward shall be shared by these persons.
- 6. A reward may be advertised by:
 - (a) a media release in a local newspaper;
 - (b) the erection of appropriate signage at the respective locations; or
 - (c) an urgent press release.
- 7. A register shall be established and maintained:

- (a) within the Parks branch for reported acts of vandalism in the Council's parks, for which a reward has been offered
- (b) within the Corporate Governance branch's Corporate Risk Management and Insurance program for reported acts of vandalism to other property of the Council, for which a reward has been offered.
- 8. The following details are to be recorded in the register:
 - (a) the name, address and phone number of any person who provides information or evidence of an offence committed under a local law or other legislation
 - (b) details of the offence
 - (c) the time and date on which the information or evidence was provided
 - (d) the time and date on which the reward was claimed
 - (e) the date on which the conviction was recorded.
- 9. An authorised officer as defined in the local laws, an employee of the Council, or an honorary park ranger, is not entitled to claim a reward unless approved by resolution of the Council.
