Introduction



Logan City Council is assessing road alignment options to improve transport connectivity in the Bahrs Scrub / Beenleigh area.

With traffic volumes set to rise, the project is tasked with providing better east west connectivity and improving traffic flow through the area.

An initial planning study identified a proposed road alignment to directly link Wuraga Road to a new four way intersection at Beaudesert Beenleigh Road and Mount Warren Boulevard.

We have asked the community what is important to them in the east west arterial connection, so we can include these factors into our overall options assessment. The available options includes the preliminary alignment identified in the planning study.

We listened to community feedback and have identified other potential alignments to be investigated as part of this study.

This is a summary of the feedback provided to Logan City Council by the community.





Project details

The study involves the partial or full realignment of the existing Wuraga Road alignment. The potential area for realignment is indicated in yellow below. The proposal is for an arterial road with the following features:

- a single 3.5m travel lane in each direction
- 3m breakdown lanes on both sides of the road
- improved intersections
- new cycling and pedestrian facilities.


