Station Road Shared Pathway

We are shaping a greener, healthier city with a new link in our shared path network at Loganlea.

Better off-road paths and improved local access means more opportunities for easier recreation and commuting.

Off-road shared paths make it safer, easier, and more desirable for people to use pathways for recreation and travel.

The upgrade will



Create safer active travel opportunities and more reliable travel times



Link to other on-road shared pathways on Station Road and Kingston Road



Deliver greater connectivity to local public transport, hospitals, schools and more.

What is happening?

We are undertaking works to build a new shared pathway on Station Road, Loganlea to improve the off-road connection from Kingston Road to Haig Road.

The project includes:

- a new section on the northern side of Station Road to connect the existing shared pathway at Kingston Road to the existing bus stop
- a shared pathway along the southern side of Station Road from Kingston Road to Haig Road
- > new and wider kerb ramps to provide smoother access between the road and the path
- > upgrades to the island refuge at Haig Road to provide a safer road crossing point
- > signage and line marking for some sections
- > a bus stop upgrade along the footpath of the project
- > road lighting upgrades at Kingston Road intersection.

This project, delivered under Council's Cycleway Network Program, is proudly supported by the Queensland Government Cycle Network Local Government Grants Program.

We have appointed BMD to undertake these \$1.6 million dollar works. Local residents will be advised before construction starts.







Every effort will be made to minimise disruption during the works. However, some temporary construction impacts can be expected. Motorists and path users are encouraged to plan their journey and allow extra travel time.

Impacts

- Changed traffic conditions including reduced speed limits, road/lane closures and detours (as needed).
- > Increased noise, dust, and vibration.
- > Temporary loss of street parking and driveway access.
- > Temporary footpath closures and bus stop relocation.
- > Possible short telecommunication outages due to raising/lowering some communication pits.

What we are doing

- > Traffic controllers will be available for detours and road/lane closures during working hours.
- > Electronic signs will be installed to communicate traffic changes.
- Affected residents and path users will be notified in advance of changes to parking and driveway access, footpath or bus stop relocations.

The Station Road Shared Pathway Project is part of Council's \$224.7 million 2022/23 budget investment in essential road and water infrastructure for a rapidly growing population.

Ongoing economic growth in Logan and across the region means we're delivering a sustainable and reliable transport network.

With our population set to exceed 500,000 by 2041, including the expected growth of Loganlea and surrounds, improving our active transport network is one of the ways we are unlocking Logan's potential and preparing for the future.

Other active transport projects include:

- Reserve Park to Pacific Highway Shared Pathway, Slacks Creek
- > Bethania to Logan Village Rail Trail.
