## Tennis

## Fact Sheet

Tennis is a largely an individual or paired sport where opponents attempt to hit the ball over a central net and into the court of play without the opponent successfully returning the ball. Each player or team serves the ball in alternating games. The winner is determined by reaching a pre-defined number of games or sets, which vary depending on the competition.

Important considerations include: top and bottom rails to provide longevity, stability and maintenance, safety and visual enhancement; visual amenity can also be improved by using black poles and mesh, and also provides good background contrast to ball colour; reduced side fencing heights to enhance spectator viewing; ensuring gates are wide enough for accessible entry and for maintenance equipment; proximity of trees and overhanging branches; windbreak planting in adjacent areas; wind and sight screening and signage loads are incorporated into structural design; future court expansion; where practical, truncate fence corners, allowing for shade structures and increased viewing areas. |
