Ben Dobbin TV Personality

Ben "Dobbo" Dobbin is one of Australia's most loved media personalities. Ben

started his career as a jackaroo in Brunette Downs and it was there where he fell in love with the land and rural Australia; it has now become his greatest passion. Dobbo spent the next 15 years as a Stock and Station Agent. In 2010 he used his passion and knowledge to start a successful meat wholesale business; Rangeland Quality Meats.

In 2011, during the Queensland Flood Appeal Dobbo's childhood friend. Ben Fordham, with whom he went to boarding school in Sydney, travelled to regional Queensland to interview flood-affected communities which included a live television interview with his best friend ('my mate Dobbo'). Dobbo stole the show and left viewers wanting more which led to appearances on The Footy Show and 60 Minutes as well as his own segment The Man on the Land on Sydney's 2GB. Soon after, he joined the Triple M family with the team on Dead Set Legends and now hosts The Rush Hour.

Jeff 'The Hornet' Horn WBO Welterweight Champion

Jeff 'The Hornet'

Horn, a renowned former WBO welterweight champion, rose to boxing stardom in 2008 under trainer Glenn Rushton's guidance. His amateur career peaked at the 2012 Olympics, where he reached the quarterfinals in the light-welterweight division, becoming Australia's most successful Olympic boxer in two decades.

Although he narrowly missed an Olympic medal, Horn's determination led to a bronze at the London Test Event and a remarkable professional career marked by victories against top opponents.

Upon retiring in 2023, Horn pursued a Bachelor of Education and worked as a PE teacher. He channelled his passion into teaching anti-bullying tactics in Queensland schools, focusing on safeguarding children from bullying. For Horn, this mission represents his next fight, demonstrating his commitment to the well-being and safety of the kids in his region.

Mollie O'Callaghan Olympic Gold Medallist

Mollie O'Callaghan was born in Queensland

and is 19 years of age. She began swimming at the age of 4 and entered her first competition 3 years later.

At the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, Mollie brought home 2 gold medals and a bronze at only 17 years old – the youngest member of the squad. Mollie swam in the heats of the 4 x 100m freestyle relay (gold), 4 x 100m medley relay (gold), and the 4 x 200m freestyle relay (bronze).

Since then, Mollie has competed at the 2022 Australian Championships, the 2022 World Championships, and the 2023 Commonwealth Games in Birmingham - where she took home 5 gold medals and 2 silvers.

Logan Martin Olympic BMX Freestyle Champion

Olympic BMX Freestyle Champion Logan

Martin started at Crestmead Skate Park from the age of 12 with his brother Nathan. Since then, he has scored accolades all across the world.

Logan scored the International Festival of Extreme Sports (FISE) World Series title in 2015 and 2016. He has also won the 2019 Urban Games Gold, then winning gold at the 2020 National Championships and again in 2021.

More recently, Logan captivated the nation by becoming the first ever BMX Freestyle Park Olympic Champion at the Tokyo Games in the inaugural event.


