Introduction

The purpose of the Jimboomba Implementation Plan is to progress the aims and objectives of the Jimboomba Local Plan (master plan) from 'visioning' to 'doing' through the process as set out in Figure 1.

The Implementation Plan does this by identifying and prioritising a number of different place-based actions that are categorised as either policy, program or project. Each place-based action ultimately contributes to the delivery vision for Jimboomba. Depending on the type of placed-based action, these may be delivered by Council, the Queensland Government, the Federal Government, the private sector or the community. The process of identification and prioritisation of place-based actions is the result of ongoing engagement with stakeholders, ensuring the place-based actions represent the current and future needs of the community, government, industry, business and landowners.

These aspirational place-based actions will assist planning and coordination across Council to deliver the actions required to progress the vision of the Jimboomba Local Plan (master plan). This approach allows Council to commit to a framework to deliver the vision of the master plan over the short term (up to five years), medium term (five to ten years) and long term (more than ten years), whilst allowing a more flexible approach in the delivery of place-based actions.

Following the Jimboomba Summit a number of key initiatives and actions were endorsed by Council which informed the Jimboomba Implementation Plan. The updated Implementation Plan reflects what has been delivered since 2016 and updates the priority place-based actions for the next five-year period (2023–2029). New actions have been added where relevant, identifying new place making priorities as the city's dynamic centres continue to progress.



Place-based actions have been recategorised by applying the overarching principles of Logan's Urban Design Framework (UDF), endorsed by Council (Figure 2). The vision of the UDF is "High quality Urban Design in Logan will drive positive place-based outcomes and is a foundation for all future investment decisions" and therefore provides the appropriate lens to consider the key actions/tasks for the Implementation Plan. When the six (6) principles are holistically considered they provide the foundation to create a high-quality built environment that matches the aspirations of its residents.

The place-based actions recommended for implementation are set out in more detail in this document. The Place Making and Urban Design Program (Economic Development and City Planning Branch) will lead the collaboration across Council, community and business stakeholders to deliver place-based actions for Jimboomba. Where identified, the internal branch/es recommended to ideally lead the project are identified. The priority place-based actions are expected to be updated regularly and do not represent a commitment by Council or other stakeholders for funding or delivery. The place-based actions can be considered for funding, applications for government grants and partnerships with a range of stakeholders that lead to the eventual delivery of the policy, program or project. The Division 9 Councillor will be consulted on all projects.

Jimboomba Priority Projects Completed

Jimboomba Place Activation and Events Strategy

Logan City Council was successful in securing a \$100,000 funding grant under the Federal Government's Building Better Regions Community Investments Stream Round 4, with the aim to deliver the Jimboomba Place Activation and Events Strategy over a five- year period. The strategy will be central to solidifying Council's commitment to tourism, growth and delivering further vibrancy and activity to Jimboomba.

On Saturday 17th September 2022 in partnership with BBQ Beer and Roadshow, Council hosted the first FLAME BBQ Street Festival on Cusack Lane and Brisbane Street in Jimboomba. It was acknowledged as a very successful event with attendance reaching over 18,000 on the event day.

Using the FLAME BBQ Street Festival as a signature launch event together with the strategy positions
Jimboomba as a unique centre in the region, attracting locals and out of region visitors.

Mt Lindesay Highway Safe Crossing Trial


The Jimboomba Summit identified a new pedestrian connection across Mount Lindesay Highway as a key priority for the local community. Another priority was to revitalise the unused railway corridor.

The safe crossing trial created a temporary structure under the Mount Lindesay Highway that connects the eastern side of Jimboomba with the Jimboomba town centre. Public lighting and CCTV was provided for community safety.

The pathway provides a safe pedestrian crossing until the Department of Transport and Main Road's upgrade of the Mount Lindesay Highway is complete.

The project started in January 2021 and concluded in March 2202 when the Department of Transport and Main Road's completed a more permanent pathway under Mount Lindesay Highway.





Jimboomba Priority Projects Funded

Cusack Lane Streetscape Enhancement Project

Following the 2019 Jimboomba Summit, the streetscape enhancement and activation of streets within Jimboomba Centre was identified as one of the key outcomes from the Summit and was included in the Jimboomba Implementation Plan as one of the priority projects.

The project is for the design and construction of the streetscape enhancements within Jimboomba.

This includes development of a streetscape master plan for key streets in Jimboomba, providing more shade including trees and more places to sit and relax including informal spaces/parklets, street furniture, public art and on street dining opportunities. Streets to be included in this master plan include Cusack Lane, Johanna Street, Honora Street and Brisbane Street, with the main focus on the Cusack Lane/Brisbane Street entry.

The project started planning and design and is expected to be completed in 2024.
