Good afternoon Karthika

Thank you for taking the time to submit an e-petition dated 26<sup>th</sup> March regarding your views on Jimmy Phillips Park.

**Petition:**

*Hillcrest residents ( New pocket of hillcrest) urgently need a proper park due to significant safety concerns, including children playing in residential streets leading to near accidents, and adults using unsuitable bus stops for exercise.*

*The nearby wetland reserve, called 'Jimmy's Park,' is not suitable for recreation as many residents, especially women, feel unsafe walking there alone, particularly in the dark, due to the presence of people perceived as dangerous.*

*A dedicated park would address these safety issues, prevent potential property damage, and provide a secure space for children.*

**Action required in response to this issue:**

*Therefore, we petition Logan City Council to proactively plan and allocate resources for the development of a safe, well-maintained park within the Hillcrest community, providing a secure space for children to play and a suitable place for adults to exercise, separate from residential roads and unsuitable wetland reserves.*

We appreciate your advocacy and the effort taken to highlight opportunities for improvement within this particular park.

Following receipt of the petition, Cr Frazer has requested an investigation and assessment of the matters you have raised, especially safety concerns.

Based on initial review, Council's Parks team will be progressing a number of initial improvements, including:

- Correcting the bollards at the park entry
- Managing overgrown vegetation at the retention basin
- Trimming overgrown trees along the pathway to improve visibility and passive surveillance

In addition, Parks will be reviewing the broader park layout, including the playground and outdoor gym equipment, to help inform future planning and upgrades.

Cr Frazer will be formally receiving the petition at the Council meeting on 17<sup>th</sup> June 2026.
