Equestrian is largely an individual-based sport but may collectively compete in a team situation where individual results are tallied. Equestrian involves a large number of disciplines, from Pony Club which is prominent with younger participants, through to dressage, show jumping, cross-country and carriage driving. Competitors are usually scored by judges on skill and performance of the horse and rider or timed with points deducted for errors. The competitor or team with the highest score wins.
